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## AWARD WINNER BIOGRAPHIES

### Valedictorian Nicole Best

With a background as an EMT and, most recently, six years as a Corrections Officer, Nicole sought a change to pursue further education in the medical field. Balancing full-time work and school proved challenging however, especially when she worked six days a week, often finishing shifts at 6 AM and heading straight to her nursing classes by 8 AM. To add to the obstacles, the week before classes started in her first term, Nicole's car was stolen and totaled. Yet, despite these setbacks, Nicole's determination never wavered.

Currently employed at a long-term care facility, Nicole plans to further her education this Fall by attending the RN program at the Community College of Philadelphia. In her spare time, she enjoys traveling with her daughter, reading, and going on nature walks-though with her busy schedule, spare time is a rare luxury.

Nicole Best graduates from the Practical Nursing program this year as the Valedictorian, with a 3.99 GPA. Her mantra, one that carried her through the challenges of nursing school, is a message she hopes to pass on to future nursing students. It can be seen on a poster at the top of the stairs leading to the nursing floor at P.I.T., and it reads: *"One syllabus at a time. One class at a time. One exam at a time. One clinical at a time. Keep going."*

### Salutatorian & Cannabis Horticulture Award Courtney Sciarrino

For the past eighteen years, Courtney Sciarrino has worked in the restaurant industry in New York State. However, in 2019, she decided that it was time for a change and enrolled in pre-collegiate classes at Erie Community College 10 years after graduating high school. She began taking classes towards a Dental Hygienist degree in September 2020.

On March 31st, 2021, another change occurred: cannabis became legal in New York State. Courtney knew right then what she wanted to do. Knowing the medical benefits that cannabis has to offer, she wanted to help change the stigma against it and begin a career in the cannabis industry. She immediately switched her major to Biotechnological Science with a Cannabis Concentration. At this time, she was pregnant and still working full-time but did not want to stop studying her passion. This is when she discovered the Medical Cannabis Horticulture online program at P.I.T. and knew it was the program for her.

*"The passion and knowledge that the professors put into each class made going to school at P.I.T. really entertaining and easy to understand."*

Equipped with the education that she received in her program, Courtney plans on obtaining a job focusing on cultivation or extraction, or possibly both. In the future, she hopes to one day open a cannabis facility that caters to both humans and animals.

Courtney would like to tell future Cannabis program students to keep advocating on the benefits of cannabis: *"We have come a long way since its prohibition, and together we can help contribute to positive changes in the industry."*

Courtney Sciarrino graduates the Medical Cannabis: Horticulture program this year as the Salutatorian, with a 3.98 GPA.
