

2019–2020 Verification Worksheet – DEPENDENT STUDENT

Your **2019–2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you and your parents reported on your FAFSA.

To verify that you provided correct information, the financial aid advisor at your school will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are any discrepancies, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You, and at least one parent, must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid advisor at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact your financial aid advisor as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

STEP 4: IDENTITY AND STATEMENT OF EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE

The student **must** meet with the Financial Aid Department in person and present the following documentation to verify the applicant's identity. Below are the items needed during the meeting.

- A valid government-issued photo identification, such as but not limited to a driver's license, non-driver's military identification or passport; and
- A signed statement certifying that the Federal student financial assistance received will only be used for educational purposes.

Note: School will provide the Statement of Educational Purpose that will need to be signed in person by the student.

STEP 5: CERTIFICATION AND SIGNATURES

WARNING: If you purposely give false or misleading information on this worksheet, you may be fined, be sentenced to serve jail time, or both.

Each person signing this worksheet certifies that all of the information reported on it is complete and correct. The student and at least one parent must sign and date.
